Mission Statement

To guide and inspire children to love learning, build strong character, and grow in their faith—all while striving to be their best in every part of life.

Vision Statement

To raise objective-driven, spiritually rooted, and academically strong students who strive with purpose and grow with faith.

1. Enrollment & Attendance

- All students must be enrolled in either:
 - A California-based home study charter (e.g., Cottonwood, Visions, South Sutter, Horizon, etc.)
 - Or registered as a Private School Affidavit (PSA) homeschooler.

- Daily attendance is mandatory. Notify the school if your child will be absent or tardy.
- Frequent unexcused absences may require a meeting and follow-up action.

2. Tuition & Fees

- Full-time (K–3): \$400/month
 - Full-time (4–5): \$350/month
 - Part-time (6–8 only): \$300/month
 - Enrichment class fee (all students): \$100/month
 - Book fee (K–5): \$400 one time fee (paid during enrollment, prior to first day)
 - Book fee (6–8): \$150 one time fee (paid during enrollment, prior to first day)
 - Registration fee (all students): \$50 prior to admission
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- Part-time programs include Islamic Studies, Qur'an, Arabic, and enrichment classes (e.g., coding, entrepreneurship).
 - Tuition is due on the first of every month, with the exception of the start of the year, which would be made prior to the first day of school. Late payments (exceeding from the Late payments may incur fees unless prior arrangements are made).

3. Dress Code

More than just creating uniformity among students, the dress code is meant to instill God-consciousness in both boys and girls- dressing according to the way Allah SWT is pleased with. As part of their Islamic Studies curriculum, and daily practice of salah, students will understand the why behind hijab and modesty.

- Students must adhere to Islamic guidelines:
 - Girls: Green shirt, beige Jumper and beige flare leggings or pants. Girls are expected to wear the white Hijab starting in 4th grade.
 - Boys: Green shirt, beige pants.
- Clothes must be clean, respectful, and free of inappropriate images or words. Size and fit must be appropriate for salah prayer.

4. Islamic Behavior & Code of Conduct

- Students are expected to uphold Islamic manners:
 - Respect for elders, teachers, peers, and self.
 - No backbiting, inappropriate language, bullying, or dishonesty.
 - Conflict resolution is to be handled respectfully with staff support. If a conflict is not resolved parents will be contacted.

5. Academics & Curriculum

- A curriculum list and supply list will be provided at the start of each year.
- Islamic Studies, Qur'an, and Arabic are core subjects for all students.
- Enrichment courses will vary by term and may include coding, finance, public speaking, and more.

6. Salah & Morning Assembly

- Students must attend the daily morning (Adhkar) and du'aa assembly.
- Dhuhr salah is prayed in congregation.
- Students are expected to participate respectfully and follow basic prayer etiquette.

7. Communication & Feedback

- Updates will be sent via email or the parent portal.
- Parents are encouraged to share feedback and participate in surveys to help us grow.
- Issues should be brought to staff promptly and respectfully.

8. Health & Safety

- Keep your child home if they are sick or contagious.
- Report any health conditions or allergies on the student form.
- Students may only be picked up by authorized adults listed on file. If another adult is to pick up the child their guardian must contact the school prior.

9. Technology Use

- Personal devices are not allowed during class time unless authorized.
- Any online content or programs used will align with Islamic values.

10. Parent Partnership & Expectations

- At Strive, we believe parents are the child's first and most important teachers.
- Parents are encouraged to take an active teaching role both at home and within the school community.
- Supporting your child's learning at home—especially in reading, Qur'an, and Islamic character—is essential.
- Parents may also guide personalized projects, field trips, or hands-on experiences through our flexible micro-school model.
- Parents are our primary partners in education and character development.
- Maintain regular communication with teachers and administration.
- Support the Islamic values and educational goals of the school.
